Student Achievement

The Sustainable Urban Planning Program measures student achievement of programmatic learning outcomes using the capstone process. Each student's project and oral presentation are graded by the student's faculty mentor using a scoring system of 1-5 (where one is highest) on the following criteria. The achievement data below is gleaned from the ratings by the faculty of students who graduated in AY 2023-24 and represents the percentage of students scoring above a 3 on each subcomponent of each criterion.

Strong written and oral communication skills 100%

Broad-based knowledge of sustainability-oriented definitions, practice, and technology 100%

Holistic ability to connect planning theory to practice to produce answers to urban planning problems 100%

Understanding of professional ethics, as set forth by the American Institute of Certified Planners 100%
